Right to Refuse Service Policy

In order to maintain a high standard of service and provide a safe work environment for its employees and volunteers, the Senior Nutrition Program reserves the right to refuse or discontinue service to homedelivered meal program clients. Service may be denied to any client or family member who acts inappropriately by disrupting the normal provision of services, or if a client's behavior or environment threatens the safety of the Senior Nutrition Program employees or volunteers.

Inappropriate behavior includes but is not limited to the following:

- Unreasonable demands for service
- Misrepresentation of the need for service
- Personally threatening and offensive language
- Threatening or erratic behavior
- Inappropriate physical contact
- Unrestrained animals

Any Senior Nutrition Program employee or volunteer can exercise the right to refuse service when confronted by a client/family member acting inappropriately or when facing an unsafe situation. They will notify their supervisor of the situation immediately for follow-up investigation.

Verification of inappropriate behavior or an unsafe situation may result in suspension or termination of service.
